The Youth Award

- Presented to a nominated sophomore, junior or senior year student from each participating area high school.
- Provides accreditation for community service and volunteer efforts that can be submitted to colleges or potential employers.
- The nominated student will receive a Youth Award Certificate, a letter for outstanding achievement, and a United States Congressional Certificate of Achievement.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- A sophomore, junior or senior year high school student who has demonstrated, through volunteer community service, a compassion and selflessness that has positively impacted one or numerous lives.
- At least 50 hours community service.
- The candidate is chosen by their high school administration and or faculty.
- A completed application form along with a minimum 300 word detailed description of the student's service, the hours worked and impact made on a group or individuals. Please email application documents as a Word file or .pdf attachment as we are unable to open Google doc attachments from school systems. Please also submit a high resolution .jpg file of the applicant, preferably a school portrait.
- Form must be certified and submitted by a school official for consideration of the award.
